What is Dual Language Immersion?

- Teaching and learning the core APS curriculum through the lens of two languages
- Integrating heritage Spanish and English speakers for academic instruction in two languages
 - 80/20 dual language immersion program model in lower primary grades
 - 50/50 dual language immersion program model in upper primary grades
- Developing fluency in another language while continuing to build literacy in a student's home language
- Motivating students to develop cross-cultural awareness and understanding

ENTRY GUIDELINES

- Elementary Immersion is available to all students countywide at Escuela Key or Claremont, depending on place of residence.
- Point of entry is Kindergarten and 1st grade.
 Students entering after 2nd grade are evaluated along specific guidelines for Spanish fluency in all language domains.
- In Middle and High School, students coming from schools other than Escuela Key or Claremont may also be admitted to the program. A placement test is required.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is an 80/20 dual language immersion program model?

The first number refers to the amount of instructional time initially spent for instruction in the target or non-English language in kindergarten and first grade. The second number refers to the percentage of time students are engaged in English instruction. In a 80/20 model the amount of time in the target language decreases yearly as English increases until there is a 50/50 balance of the languages in grades four and five.

What specialized training do Immersion teachers have?

Immersion classroom teachers are required to hold a Virginia teacher's license in elementary education. At the secondary level, teachers are certified in the subject area they teach (Spanish, Social Studies, or Science).
