Students in Marilyn Faris Scholl's Family and Consumer Sciences classes at the Shriver Program completed a fun and delicious activity while learning about bones and the importance of eating more vegetables.

Students in Emily Williams's Grade 7, period 1 Digital Input Technology class at Swanson worked in Adobe Photoshop as part of their Using Digital Tools and Resources unit. After learning about the different screen parts and tools of Photoshop, students used the tools and filters on images from the internet. At the end of the unit, students will make backgrounds and characters for a game they will create in Scratch.



Technology Education students at Swanson applied the design process to make custom jig-saw puzzles. Students used demonstrations, practice, and rubrics to learn Adobe Illustrator for their unique creations. Each student then manufactured wood material to place in the Universal Laser System to cut and engrave their projects, before they glued, sanded, and colored the final piece.
