Comments from community:

- **Work with transportation to make sure streets are appropriate**
- **Create a positive contribution to the livability of AHCA residents**
- **Develop a comprehensive plan for this site that includes all three buildings and parking lot**
- **Consider more HBW-like buildings instead of comprehensive high schools**
- **Remember pedestrians along Walter Reed**
- **Don't let this process derail or slow down good improvements on Walter Reed**
- **Keep CTE classes – trades are important**
- **Consider neighborhood impact**
- **Bravo to your process – love idea of Arlington Tech**
- **Please keep in mind that this area is a neighborhood first**
- **Thank you for future Montessori school at Henry – great solution/very excited about opportunity**
- **Please encourage public transit to all schools**

- **Concerned with the thinking that students who choose HB or Arl Tech don't need sports facilities comparable to other high schools**
- **Don't underestimate demand for program such that we can't expand in future as needed**
- **Keep equity in funding the physical building in mind – make comparable to recent building construction at other high schools**
- **Have HS students start using ART buses instead of APS buses**
- **Explore making entire site a high school campus, inclusive of multiple programs – Arl Mill, Career Center &/or IB/Arts/other small programs – to alleviate HS capacity issues. Find another home for Montessori program which is far smaller than our HS capacity needs. Many small projects can be more expensive and time-consuming than one larger project – or so we heard from APS with the recent elementary additions process**
