A pool, a track, other sports fields, a full gym, and some kind of auditorium/theater space - all of which could be shared in the off-hours with the larger Arlington community - are essential to prevent waiver requests to other neighborhood HSs that offer a more full complement of amenities. Keeping the public library onsite is also vital to engaging the community - perhaps the school library could be adjacent and/or share space and resources with the public one.

The needs of these students should be placed ahead of the needs of approx. 350 community high school students, who do not need amenities and who can be easily relocated to the many empty commercial spaces up and down Columbia Pike. 4. Arlington is facing a crisis in student population. We should not repeat the mistakes of past, and start building TODAY for the seats we need tomorrow. 5.
