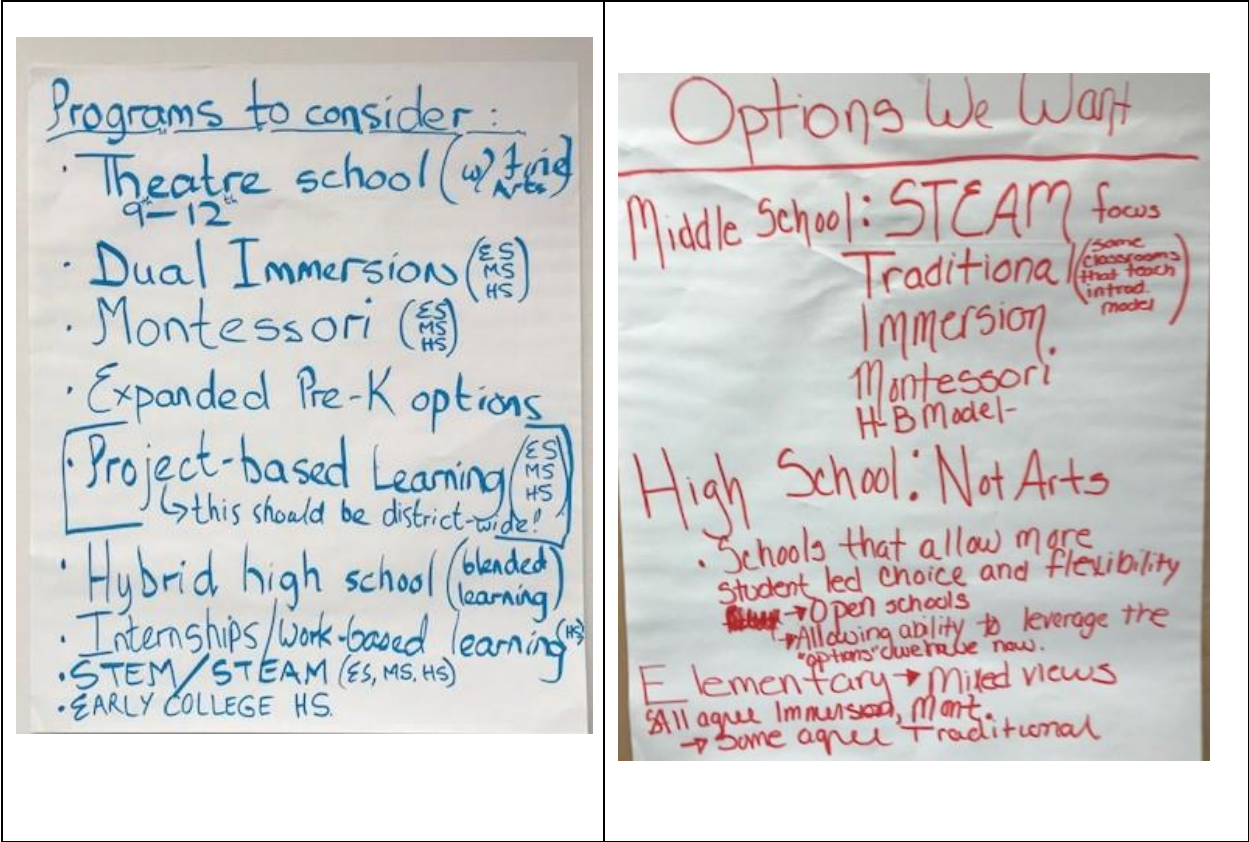


Discussion Points from the School Representatives Work Meeting (Mar. 21)
