



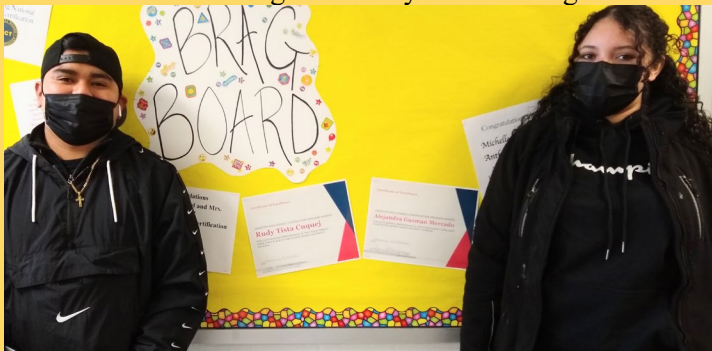

Two students in Iris Gibson's Economics & Personal Finance class at Langston won first place in the George Mason University division of the Stock Market Game. Both students invested in Apple and Nike. Students in the class also researched Mutual Funds and they chose a couple of index funds that had a good history of increasing value.



Eleventh-grade students in Gareth Hall's IB Design Technology class created personalized passive AMP prototypes using retro designs. First, students researched the retro styling of products. Then, they developed their own designs using isometric drawing, which they used as a reference for modeling in Fusion 360. Students learned of the importance of design for manufacture when using rapid prototyping technologies. Students were challenged to modify their designs at each stage in response to new knowledge/skills & understanding.
