Naming Policy Criteria

Name of an Individual:

- Contributed to society in ways that supported the success and well-being of the individuals who live in Arlington, Virginia or the United States, now and in the future
- Their “principal legacy” aligns with the APS mission, vision, and core values and beliefs
- Has been deceased for five or more years

Geographical or Historical Relationships:

- Names of places in the neighboring community, Arlington or Virginia.
- Landmarks or places that have historic or geographic significance to the Arlington community’s history and the site

Other:

- Articulate aspirations of the **educational outcomes for Arlington’s students**
- Reflect the **instructional focus** of the school
- Consider the **diverse community** that they serve
- **Avoid duplicating** names of other schools in the region to prevent possible confusion with those schools



Timeline for Our Work

- January 31: Informational and Introductory Meeting; Initial Brainstorm
- February 28: Names submitted, Arlington Historical Society feedback and Survey Prep for Civic Associations and Community
- March 20: Survey results conversation and final vote by Committee
- April 25: Presentation to School Board
- May 9: School Board votes on the name
