The meeting started at 7:08pm.

- 1. 7 members were present: Erik Sullivan (Chair), Chuck Rush, Katherine Christensen, Jennifer Wagener, Chris Cummings, Peter Strack, and Jonathan Hui
- 2. Approval of meeting minutes
  - Postponed until later in the budget cycle
- 3. Public comment
  - Josh Folb, AEA:
    - o Governor's current working budget calls for a 3% raise for teachers
      - APS may not be eligible for some of these funds based on the way our currently proposed salary increases are structured
      - Budget is still a work in progress
- 4. Budget Update
  - The School Board requested APS to work on plans for addressing the current deficits in the budget
  - Believe the upcoming work session will discuss what appears to be staffing shifts at the school level that do not necessarily align to enrollment changes
- 5. Review of BAC discussion on Proposed Budget (from previous meeting)
  - Discussion around student-based budgeting, rather than planning factors/staffing-level funding
  - The "averages" of APS teacher to student ratios are difficult to analyze without having more data
  - Discussion around higher cost per student
    - Things do cost more closer to the city
      - For example, APS leases parking spaces at some of our urban schools that more suburban school systems will not have
    - Some of our programs cost more on a relative basis given our small size and lack of economies of scale
  - How is "success" measured? How does APS compare in terms of success metrics to our neighboring jurisdictions?
