School Board Advisory Committees



- The School Board actively seeks the advice of community members through a wide range of committees and councils on issues or policies related to the successful operation of the school system.
- There are currently eight School Board Advisory Committees in APS, one of which is required by law (ASEAC).

Advisory Council Teaching & Learning



- ACTL is made up of 40-50
 individuals with
 representatives from
 each school and certain
 community organizations
- They review system-wide curriculum and instructional programs and develop recommendations for improvement.
- 14 content and/or program area subcommittees that report to the Advisory Council at least annually





Challenges & Opportunities



Challenges

- Existing advisory bodies sometimes operating in siloes on issues that cross multiple advisory bodies
- Desire for parent/community input and recommendations to be informed by APS staff expertise, and vice versa
- Advisory bodies sometimes working on issues that are not a high priority for the School Board or well-aligned with strategic plan which creates frustration among some volunteer advisory council members that recommendations aren't immediately acted upon.

Opportunities

- New strategic plan offers an opportunity to better align the work of the Advisory Councils with the priorities and performance objectives in the 2024-30 Strategic Plan
- Support continuous improvement efforts in alignment with the Strategic Plan


