

Subcommittees

A subcommittee is a smaller group within an Advisory Council. Subcommittees are typically given specific tasks to support the work of the Council, such as producing a report of findings and/or recommendations on a specific topic.

The Working Group's initial proposal is that subcommittees may be established under each of the five proposed Advisory Councils. In the current APS policy, subcommittees exist within the Advisory Council on Teaching & Learning (ACTL):

The working group is considering TWO options and is seeking community feedback on which option would best support the work of Advisory Council's and School Board Priorities?

Opt 1 - Subcommittees are established on an as-needed basis ("Ad Hoc") ONLY

- In this option, the decision on convening a new or pre-existing subcommittee would be made annually by the School Board and/or the Advisory Council
- The School Board's charge would define the duration of the subcommittees work, which would generally be 1 year or less but may be convened for multiple years based on

need.

Opt 2 - Subcommittees are established on as-needed basis basis AND some standing subcommittees that meet annually

Under this option, the flexibility to establish subcommittees on as needed basis remains.
 In addition, some subcommittees (current or newly proposed) would be established in School Board policy and convene annually to fulfill a charge from the School Board. This could include some of the current ACTL subcommittees AND any newly proposed subcommittees.
