Welcome to ACI!

We are delighted you have agreed to serve as a member of the School Board's Advisory Council on Instruction (ACI) during the 2014-2015 school year, and we look forward to our first meeting on Wednesday, September 10. You will find in this letter, and attached to it, useful information which will provide an overview of ACI and its work, and will be the start of practical guidelines through the year's activities.

Background

- The purpose of ACI is to provide the School Board community input and feedback for instructional planning of the school system. We assist in the continuous systematic review of various aspects of the instructional program and in the development of recommendations for instructional improvement, including recommendations for the introduction of new programs. We also conduct studies of instructional topics from time to time as determined by the School Board.
- The ACI itself is an umbrella committee made up of one representative (and an alternate) from each elementary school, two representatives from each secondary school, and representatives from several community organizations. Each school selects its ACI member through its PTA. The School Board appoints the members representing schools and community organizations for a two-year period, trying to ensure there is good representation from across the county.
- The Advisory Council on Instruction is in turn advised by 14 curricular/program advisory committees, listed on page 2. Each of these committees participates in the School Board's reporting process every year, either by presenting recommendations for instructional improvements in its subject area (one year), or by presenting a status report of its activities (the following year). As shown on the attached Reporting Schedule, each advisory committee first presents its report to the ACI and later to the School Board.
- In late January, after ACI has had a chance to consider, deliberate, and prioritize all the year's recommendations and APS staff has had an opportunity to formulate responses to them, the School Board holds a work session on ACI, where chairs of ACI's committees making recommendations make a brief presentation to the Board followed by a discussion among Board members, staff, and committee chairs. These recommendations and interactions inform the School Board's budget deliberations that start in February.

Schedules

- Our first meeting is scheduled for **Wednesday, September 10, 2014**, at the Syphax Education Center, 2110 Washington Blvd. At **6:30 p.m.**, the School Board will host a reception in the lobby preceding the meeting; then the meeting itself will begin promptly at **7:00 p.m.** The agenda and directions to the meeting place are attached.
 - **Please note the earlier starting time for the reception. The other ACI meetings will begin at the regular 7:00 p.m. starting time.**

- Also attached is a list of the meeting dates for the year. In order to respect everyone's time, the meetings (after September 10) begin promptly at 7:00 p.m.; our goal is to finish no later than 9:00 p.m. During these meetings, we learn how the school system works and how ACI fits into that process; we consider and vote on the specific recommendations of the seven advisory committees scheduled to report with recommendations this year, and we hear status updates from the other seven committees which report without recommendations this year.
